Anitah joined DeepBlue in 2015 for the show *India Stories*, and has been involved with the group through the YoungBlue program since she was 11 years old! Anitah loves seeing others inspired to get creative with their instruments through DeepBlue. Anitah also performs with contemporary string group, Luminescence, and the Brisbane Philharmonic Orchestra. When Anitah is not playing cello, she's probably huddled over some books finishing her final year of Law and Justice or working on events and festivals!





Before she was a member of DeepBlue, Kaitlyn was also a YoungBlue participant! Her passion for music has pushed her through life and she one day hopes to dominate the world stage as a multi-genre violinist and inspire people of all ages to pursue music. Outside of the practice room, Kaitlyn is often found writing and recording string covers, taking apart old electronic gear to see how they work, or researching and designing new tech to create her own brand of electric string instruments and pedals.

Allan began his music degree playing classical trumpet and finished it playing his trumpet through his computer. One of the heads behind the technological side of DeepBlue, Allan spends most of his time fiddling about with musical machines, playing conventional instruments in unconventional ways, and generally having a laugh bending sound into interesting shapes. He has been involved in many of DeepBlue's educational programs and loves nothing more than opening and de-mystifying the world of electronic music.





The effect that music has on people and its role within communities across the world is Sophie's passion, working in community music programs in the Solomon Islands, Peru, Zimbabwe and across Australia. Q. What instruments can be involved in the Winter(ish)School?

A. All stringed instruments, keyboard, drums/percussion, guitars and electronic instruments. Some woodwind and brass can be catered for, but please get in touch.

Q. I don't play a musical instrument but am really interested in live music production, visuals or stage design and management - can I be part of Winter(ish)School?

A. Yes! We offer learning opportunities in these areas on a case-by-case basis. We would for you to get in touch to have a chat about this exciting area of DeepBlue and the program.

A. The ticket price includes morning and afternoon tea each day of the Winter(ish)School. Just bring your lunch!

Q. Can I book a private lesson with a member of DeepBlue?

A. Yes! Private lessons can be booked via email after registration. Lessons are available for violin, viola and cello. Please enquire if you are looking for another instrument

Q. I haven't been learning my instrument for very long, can I participate?

A. We generally require participants to have be AMEB Preliminary level or equivalent. You will be grouped with other musicians of a similar age and experience. Ask your teacher or get in touch if with us if you are unsure.
